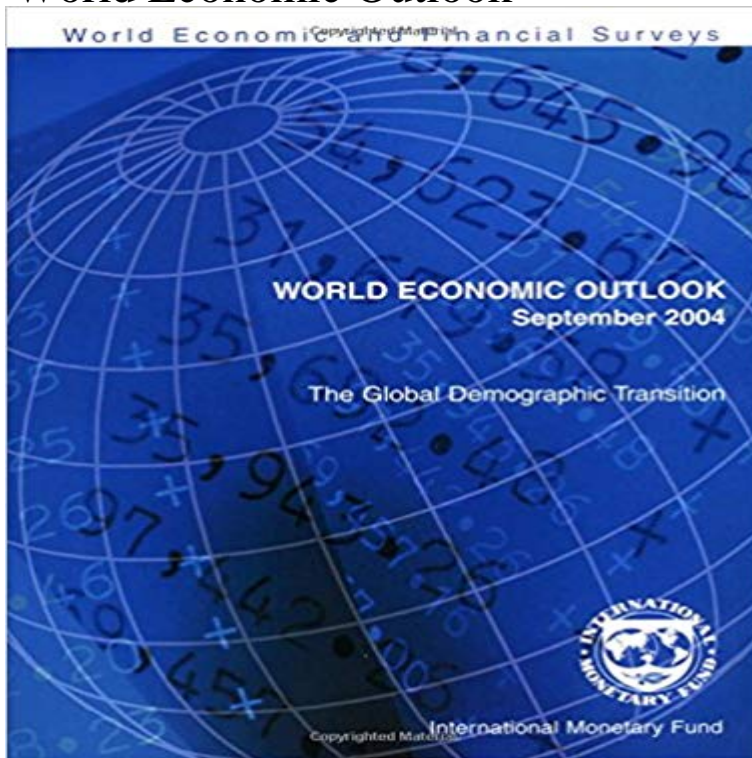


World Economic Outlook
