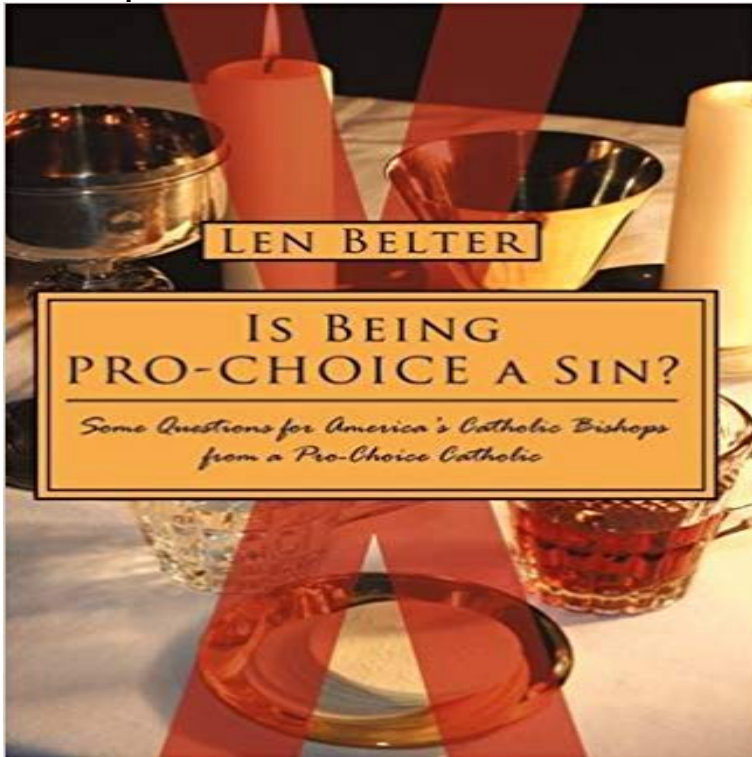


## Is Being Pro-Choice a Sin?: Some Questions for Americas Catholic Bishops from a Pro-Choice Catholic
