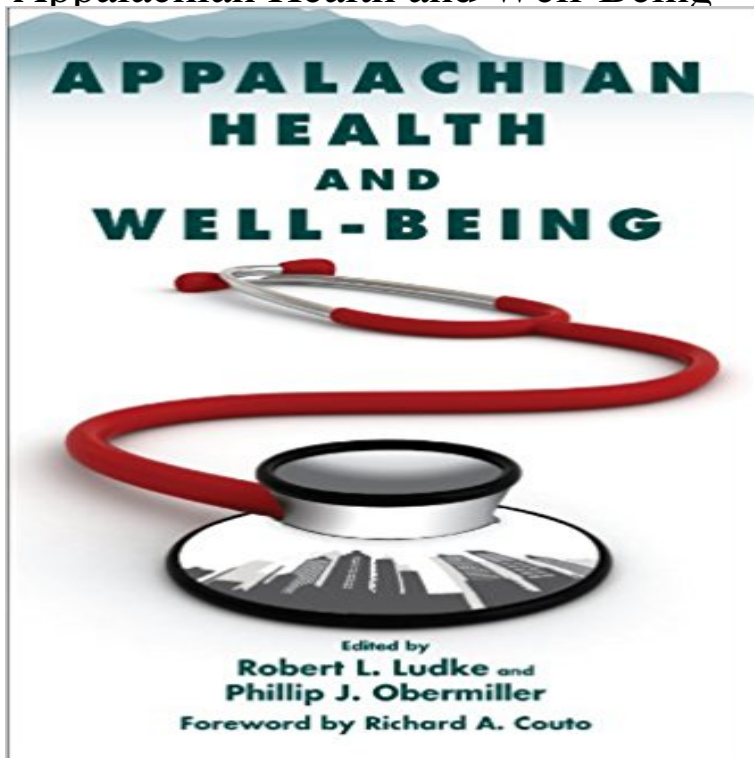


Appalachian Health and Well-Being
