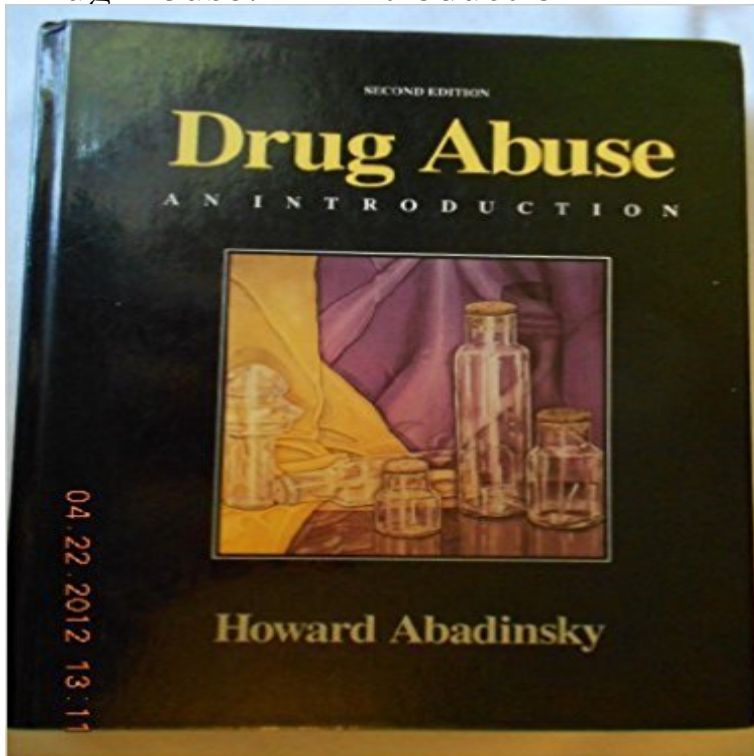


Drug Abuse: An Introduction
