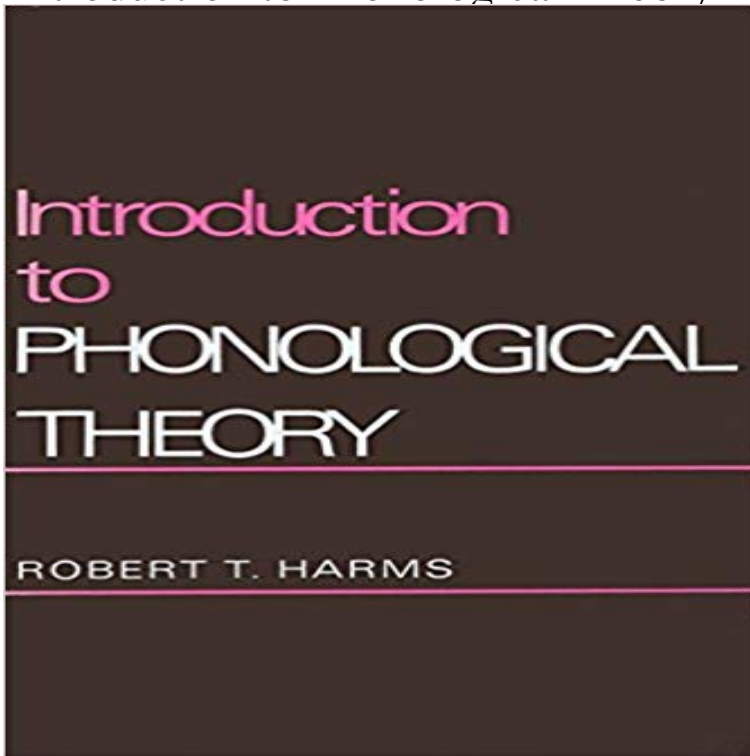


Introduction to Phonological Theory
