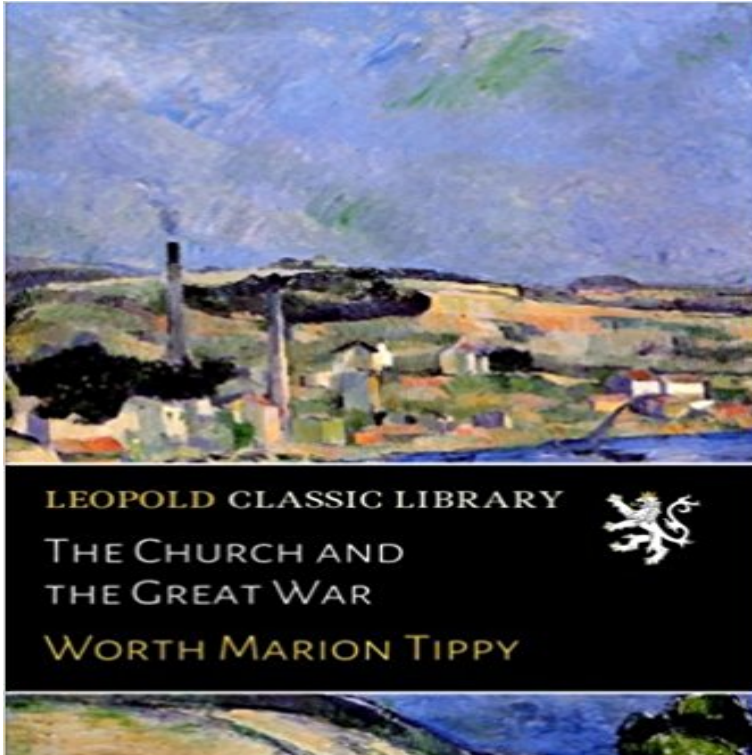


The Church and the Great War
