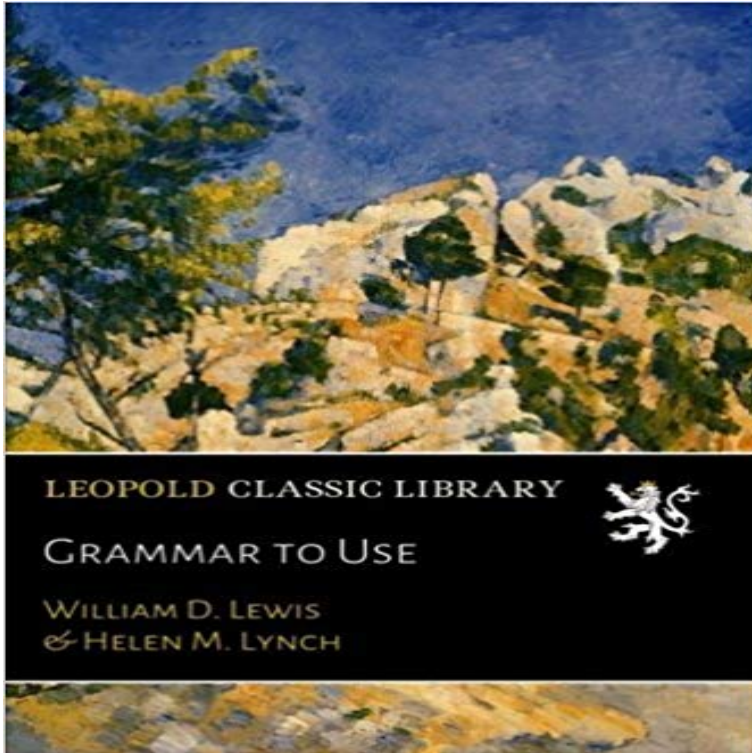


Grammar to Use
