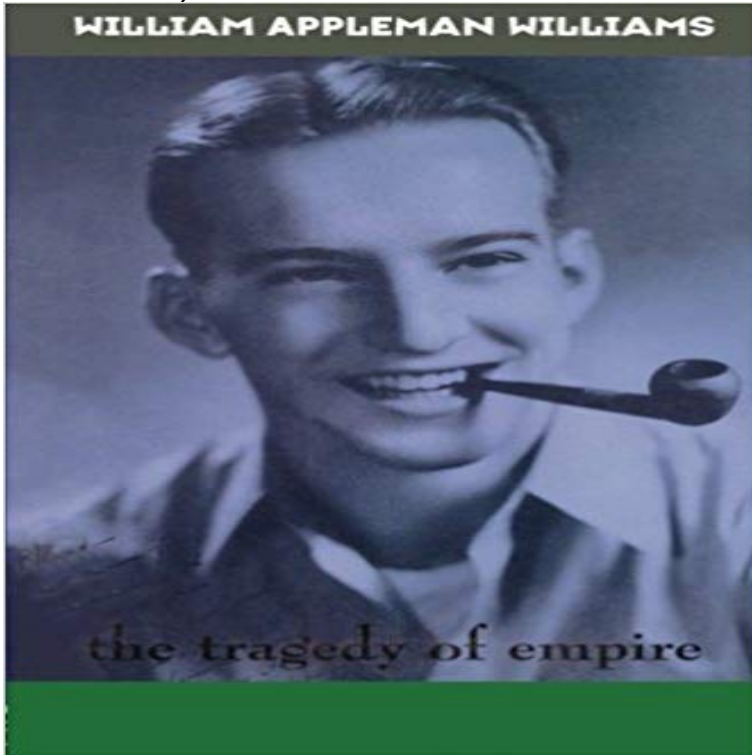


William Appleman Williams: The Tragedy of Empire (American Radicals)
